## A Universal Stamp Album Page

by Bernard V. Sigg (#748)

If you have been frustrated in your search for a suitable collection format to mount your collection, I offer you my solution to use in any way you desire.

**The Problem** - A space for every stamp you wish to mount does not exist in any album available from commercial sources. I tried everything - single albums -- Scott's Internationals -- misc. supplements - Result?: Frustration.

**The Solution** - The binder was easy. I found (at a discount office supply store) one-inch 3-ring binders at 97¢ each available in boxes of twelve. My entire worldwide used collection with spaces through 1955 is housed in 157 volumes.

The page was next - use your imagination -- what do you want? Numerical order (my choice) -- set compatibility -- exotic display, etc. My system is a three step system - (1) Master-Master, (2) Master, (3) Album Page, and the use of a copy machine.

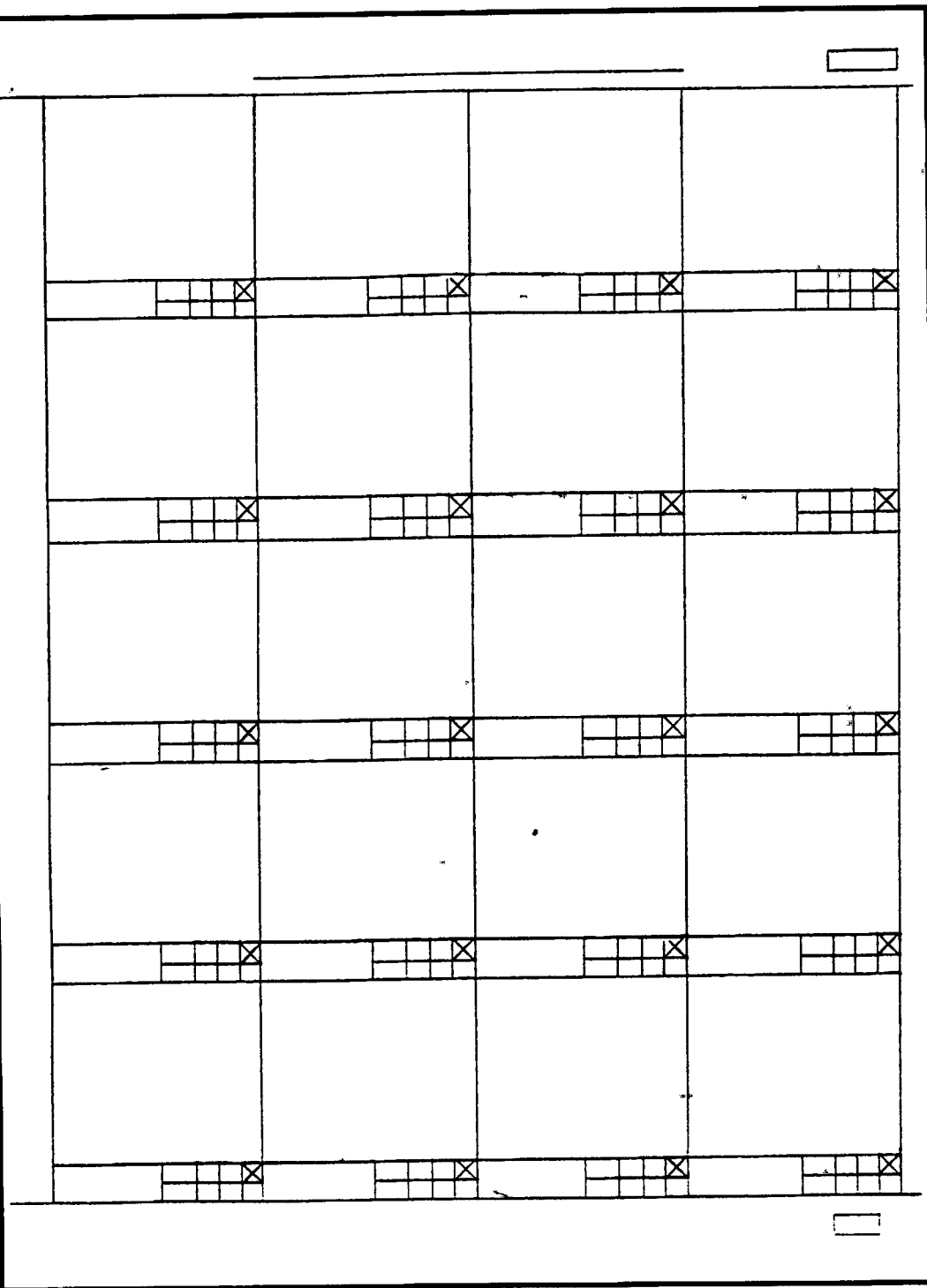


Figure 1: Master-Master Page

**Master-Master** -- one page -- (See Figure 1) This is the foundation of the whole system. The page was drawn by hand and then copied. I tried 5x5 stamps but found 4x5 is better considering today's larger stamps. My Master-Master page has 20 blocks. Each block has small spaces at the bottom for recording information -- catalog number/value/condition/perf/watermark/etc. Again the choice is yours.

**Master** - As many as

required - 1 copy each. You type numbers on a copy of the Master-Master to make Master originals for each set of 20 stamps. Thus Scott # 1-20 becomes a Master, Scott #21-40 another, Scott #C1-C20 another, any 20 stamps or whatever.

**Album Page** -- To create an album for a country, say Australia, all that is necessary is to select Masters for the desired stamps; copy the Masters, type Australia at the top of each page, punch holes on the left and instant stamp album (See Figure 2). My Australian Album has spaces for Scott # 1-1500, C1-C20, L1-L100. For Blocks and multi-stamp sets, using one number -- just copy a Master-Master and type it to suit and insert it in numerical order.

Depending on how many stamps are actually in a binder -- 2000 to 3000 -- is about the limit per one-inch binder. As my albums are strictly alphabetical by choice, my binder contains Ascension, Australia, Azerbaijan, and Azores, and has the country names typed on the end and is #8 in my series of albums. USSR (Russia) requires three binders with pages 1-6400, B1-180, C1-C140, L1-L20, N1-N60, plus Armies and Offices.

## Beginner's Column by Al and Mildred Felnberg (#361)

Semi-postal stamps is the topic for today. They are a form of a tax on postage. Scott lists them with a "B" in front of the number. In some countries they are mandatory and must be used on all mail; in other instances they are voluntary. I collect them because I find them to be very educational. You can learn a lot about a country from these semi-postals. They usually portray the purpose for which they are issued. A good bit of the funds go to charity, youth programs, hospitals, etc.

Some collectors believe these stamps were issued primarily for collectors and refuse to collect them. In most cases they cost more than regular postage issues but were issued in lesser quantities therefore increase in value faster. Like regular stamps, price is based on supply and demand.

My favorite semi-postals come from Belgium. Some may say that there are too many of them and too costly, but I find them fascinating, colorful and

beautiful stamps. Quite a few are engraved and I have always preferred engraved stamps.

The best way to collect them is to buy complete sets. Broken sets are very hard to fill. If you find them too expensive you may want to buy short sets avoiding the most expensive stamps in the set, thus you can have a few stamps from each set. Of course, like any broken sets they have little value when you dispose of your collection. Some early semi-postals are regular issues overprinted or surcharged with the extra denomination. Once you start collecting semi-postals you will find it hard to stop.

Some countries issue semi-postal airmails. Scott catalogues list them with a "CB" in front of the number.

I don't recommend semi-postals for everyone but for those of you who can spend the extra money I'm sure you'll find them as fascinating as I do. ••

## Debs 1992 Supplement Released

A supplement to Debs first worldwide album was issued a few months ago. It adds about 1,600 1992 issues to the main album, covering almost 10,000 stamps and souvenir sheets in all.

Unlike the album, the supplement was printed on single sided paper and developed completely electronically. The resulting print provides sharp, clear images. A brief errata notes corrections to the main album itself. Some 1991 and 1993 issues were printed in error. The validity of some of the Russian local overprints, such as Chechenya, are written of here as well.

The supplement is available for \$25 (plus \$6 shipping) from the publishers. Topical collectors will appreciate the well annotated index of 1992 issues. Its extensive listing is quite detailed, allowing quick access to the actual issue in the album. This is offered separately at \$20.

We are fortunate in the USA to enjoy a standard of living that many nations do not have. An IRC can truly help you establish good trading relationships without unduly penalizing your potential overseas trader.

How many of you have searched the discount stores, looking for philatelic items to give a child or grandchild? Frustrating wasn't it? H.E. Harris & Company reports that worldwide collecting kits ranging in price from \$5.95 to

\$19.95, will soon be available in Wal-Mart stores. If you don't find them in YOUR Wal-Mart, ask the Manager to stock them. The kits contain a small album, stamps, a magnifier, and hinges. Just right for that youngster you've wanted to interest in stamp collecting! Hopefully, this will lead to better availability of basic philatelic supplies in other mass markets, too. The decline in new collectors is often due to the difficulty of finding supplies to keep interest levels high. Gone are the days many of us remember when finding packets of stamps and other supplies was as easy as going to Woolworth's. Congratulations to H.E. Harris for an eagerly awaited marketing move!

We have several new youth members. Please help these young people by sending some stamps to them, if you can.
