

When I was about 8 years old, I was introduced to stamp collecting through the Boys Club of America in Astoria, New York. # **Grab Bag Trial Program**

here are many members of the ISWSC who do not participate in the Swap Circuit, for any of several reasons. Here's a new trial new program to exchange stamps with other ISWSC members once a year—"Grab Bag". Here's how the program will work:

- Submit 100 used stamps (off paper), all in one category – either all Large or all Small. (Anything larger than 1" x 1" is considered Large for this program.) Do not send damaged, obliterated, or CTO stamps. Remember, the recipient of your grab bag is looking for collectible stamps, not wallpaper!
- 2. Stamps should be in a glassine, not loose, with one packet per outer cover.

  Multiple submissions are okay. To enhance further trading, you can enclose a memo or ID in the glassine, or you may remain anonymous.
- 3. Each submission must include a self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE) or International Reply Coupons, otherwise your packet will be forwarded to the Vice President for Charitable Services as a donation. You are

requested to indicate the stamp category ("Large" or "Small") on the lower left front corner of both the outer cover and the SASE to help minimize errors.

- 4. Mail your Grab Bag(s) by Feb. 28, 2006 to:

- 5. Neither the ISWSC nor I accept responsibility for the quality or quantity of stamps in the glassines YOU are the program!

It is my intent to remail the SASEs (with the correct category of stamps enclosed) ASAP. Your comments, after receipt of your exchanged grab bag, are encouraged. A summary of all comments

received (along with the number of participants) will be used to determine if the program will be continued.

So why not give it a try? The worst that can happen is you lose 100 duplicate stamps and some postage. Conversely, you just might find some usable stamps and a new trading partner!

# **Whatzit?**

his is the first Whatzit? article by Richard Barnes (#2425), newly appointed coordinator of the Whatzit? program. The program is designed to help members identify unknown stamps and to share knowledge concerning how to identify difficult stamps.

During Christmas 1980, my beautiful wife, known worldwide as "She Who Must Be Obeyed" (or SWMBO for short) was concerned that my hobby

of 30 years, military history, was threatening to creep out of my reading room. I was presented with a stamp album, catalogue and some stamps. It was her belief that collecting "those little stamps" would take up less room

and cost less. I must admit to having my hobby now overflowing from the stamp room and into other parts of the house. I collect Middle East, North Africa and British North America.

Reading past copies of *The Circuit*, the main function of the Whatzit? column has been to identify stamps that members submit. This service to members will continue. In my position as coordinator, I would like to open this column to members who have found a stamp they can not immediately identify and to those who did research and now know what they have.

Please share your pleasure of the search and further our knowledge. I have the expertise of other members to assist me in the search for answers to member's inquiries. Most important, this column needs the input of all members. Unknown stamps will be illustrated. The intent is that the members who have knowledge will see the unknown stamp and then let us all know what we have.

Searching for Sand Dunes/Wall Paper stamps/ Trucial States stamps started me purchasing at the local auction Junk Boxes, Boxes of Stuff, Floor Sweepings, etc. This was my introduction to items not listed in Scott catalogues. Recently I came across a Canal Maritime De Suez stamp (fig 1).

It is the height of European imperial expansion. The French company, Compagnie du Canal Maritime de Suez had a large French work force digging the canal. These men demanded efficient mail service home to Europe.

In 1868, Gustave Riche recommended to the company that it upgrade the postal facilities by creating their own postal service. These improvements would be paid for by the sale of stamps to the workers. A set of four - one centime black, five centimes green, twenty centimes blue and forty centimes red - were lithographed by M. Chezaud of Paris. The new postal service on the Isthmus of Suez was successfully established and was functioning when it came to the attention of the Egyptian authorities.

At the time, there were civil demonstrations by local Egyptian workers who were not getting work on the canal. The Compagnie claimed that it was more cost-effective to bring in French workers than hire locally. Pride and politics brought the end to the use of these stamps after only two months of service, July and August 1868. The Egyptian Government exerted its sovereignty and the Royal Egyptian Postal Service

took over the responsibility of moving all mail on the Isthmus of Suez.

M. Riche had adroitly made certain that this new postal service and stamps in a romantic location was known to the philatelic world. He was able to recoup the company's cost and made a bit on the side for himself by selling the now-demonetised stamps to collectors. It turned out

that the demand for these stamps was greater than the supply. As usual, entrepreneurs filled the demand.

The forgeries of the Suez Canal stamps are mentioned in the publication "Spud Papers". The monthly magazine "Stamp Review" in 1938 carried an extensive and detailed study of the Suez Canal Stamps. Most forgeries are "quite crude and easily recognized". However, The Fournier forgery is quite good, but is easily recognized following the details listed in "Stamp Review" Vol 2, No. 3 (March 1938). I must admit that (figure 1) is a Fournier forgery.

I hope a member will recognize this black, imperf, 3?, stamp? (figure 2).

# **Postcards From Puffinland**

couple of years ago I attended a large stamp show in London. I like to go to these shows since there are usually dozens of philatelic agencies represented and I can frequently get any recent issues that I might have missed otherwise.

As I wandered the aisles I encountered a booth for Lundy Island Post! I hadn't thought of this "country" literally since my childhood—a lot of years ago. Then you could buy packages of the stamps of Lundy Island at the local stamp shop for about 10

cents a package.

Lundy Island is a tiny three mile long island just off the southwestern Devon coast of England. In 1925 a wealthy individual bought the entire island and then declared himself to be King Harman I and proceeded to issue stamps and coins. Unfortunately King George didn't take to this competition and King Harman soon found himself in court and forced to abdicate. But the stamps remained as a local issue.

All of the stamps were issued in sets denominated

in puffin and half puffin increments. And each stamp had a picture of a puffin as its main feature – rather pudgy little sea birds with large beaks. Unfortunately the stamps of the time were only printed in monochromes so they don't reflect the beautiful bright colors of these birds.

There still exists a private post office on the island of Lundy and you can buy and use these stamps to pay to have your mail carried from there to the mainland where regular UK stamps are affixed before

they are placed into the real mail stream.

I carefully addressed a couple of dozen postcards for my friends and gave them to the booth attendant to arrange to take them back to Lundy for "mailing." Unfortunately she didn't really know what she was supposed to do and affixed the Lundy "stamps" in the normal upper right hand corner.

Turned out this violated British mail regulations and someone in Lundy actually had to remove them, with considerable damage, and reaffix them to the left side of the cards before they could be dropped in

England.



# Collectors Make Major Stamp Swap

In a multimillion-dollar swap, a California collector traded a block of four 1918 stamps bearing the image of an upside-down plan Wednesday for an equally rare 1868 one-cent stamp.

The blockbuster transaction filled out what experts believe is the only complete collection of 19th-century United States stamps.

The block of four stamps is valued at \$3 million, and the single "Z Grill" stamp is similarly valued.

"This isn't like kids swapping stamps," Said Charles Shreve, president of Shreves Philatelic Galleries in Manhattan, where the trade was made, "The 'Z Grill' is like the Holy Grail of U.S. stamps—it's the Hope diamond of American philately."

At the heart of the deal is Bill Gross, of Newport Beach, California, who was missing the one-cent "Z Grill" stamp owned by Donald Sundman, president of Mystic Stamp Co., of Camden, New York.

Gross now has "a comprehensive, complete collection representing every 19th century U.S.

postage stamp ever made," Shreve said. The collection contains about 300 stamps.

Small, blue-hued and bearing the images of Benjamin Franklin, the "Z Grill" is so named because

of the waffle-like grill pressed into the back that better absorbed postmarks and prevented people from washing off the cancellation and reusing the stamp.

It's one of only two existing "Z Grill" stamps; the other is owned by The New York Public Library.

Sundman said he plans to show his "Inverted Jenny" stamps at exhibitions around the

country. The 24-cent stamps have the Curtiss JN-4 biplane, knows as "Jenny," mistakenly printed upside-down.

Gross was not present Wednesday and would not immediately comment on the trade. He plans to exhibit his newly acquired "Z Grill" at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington in May, at the same time the "Inverted Jenny" will be displayed at the National Postal Museum, Shreve said.
